


The O'Neill household lives in Grand Ledge where one of our entertainments each autumn is to watch the city's giant leaf-sucking machine pass by and consume the piles of leaves residents of the neighborhood have raked to the curb. Whoever invented the Snuffleupagus, or whatever it's called, is a saint in my book. Our house is bracketed by large silver maples whose roots push up above ground making for treacherous footing, whose seeds in the

spring can fill two fifty-gallon yard waste bins, and whose huge fallen leaf output inspires memories of the Grand Tetons. We appreciate the shade but we pay a dear price for it in raking.

Years ago I lived in Evanston, Illinois, where we were instructed to rake leaves directly into the street. There the city would dispatch a giant end-loader to chug around the neighborhoods and scoop several block's worth of leaves into a mountain, then load dump trucks to haul the autumn collection away. Occasionally, the coordination of end-loader and dump truck was poor and the gigantic leaf piles would remain overnight.

One memorable evening some hapless driver apparently decided that the thrill of his day would be to blast through one of these mounds in his sports car. This proved to be unwise. The pile was high. The leaves were damp and dense. They would not have yielded to a Cadillac, much less a Triumph TR3.

I didn't witness the attempt – only the aftermath. The cute little car sat as though on display on top of the only slightly flattened pile, its tires suspended a couple of feet above the pavement. There was no sign of the driver; he was off seeking a tow truck, no doubt, and therefore was guilty of "leafing" the scene of an accident.

In Greek mythology there was a giant named Antaeus who drew his strength from the earth. No one could beat him in battle until they lifted him off the ground, and then he became weak and defenseless. Dietrich Bonhoeffer, martyred pastor and theologian in Germany during the Nazi era, wrote of his time, "One may ask whether there have ever before in human history been people with so little ground under their feet."

In Ephesians 3:17, we are challenged to let "Christ ... dwell in our hearts through faith, as you are being rooted and grounded in love." Cars, giants, and mere mortals must each struggle to keep in contact with what grounds us. It's when we lose traction with Christ that we lose momentum and become mired in enmity and fear. The detours we take can leave us high and helpless. The ground of our faith remains firm, however. The love of Christ can bear the weight of our lives, if we trust it.

We have committed to providing 20 Christmas dinner food baskets, each including a ham. Please find in the Green Room a laundry basket and the grocery list for a family of 4-8 people. Be sure to sign the project participation sheet when you do so.

FOOD BASKETS If you are interested in contributing \$25 toward the cost of the hams (with or without a grocery basket), note that on the sign-up sheet as well, and put your check in the lock box outside of the Church Office, made out to Eastminster Presbyterian Church and noting "Hams" in the memo line. No one needs to actually purchase a ham. The church mission folks will take care of ordering them and delivering them with the baskets.

If you are able to help re-assemble and deliver the baskets to the Salvation Army offices on South Pennsylvania on the morning of Tuesday, December 12, 2016, between 9 and 11 a.m., please note your commitment to help with that on the sign-up sheet as well.

The filled baskets should be delivered to Eastminster on Monday, December 11, between 9 a.m. and 3 p.m., or <u>early</u> on Tuesday, December 13, between 9 and 9:45 a.m. <u>If delivering on Monday, remove perishables from your basket and place them in the refrigerators</u>, either on the main floor of the church or in the kitchen in the lower level. If delivering early on Tuesday morning, just leave your filled baskets in the church kitchen on the main floor.

If you sign up to provide a food basket but find you cannot provide one after all, please contact Sam O'Neill <u>before</u> Monday, December 11, at 517-243-2669, so that provisions can be made to fulfill our commitment to the Salvation Army of 20 baskets.




Faith & Film Monday, November 20 @ 6:00 p.m.


