The events in Charlottesville, VA showed the world a dark and chilling side of America and exposed the undercurrent of hatred and fear that runs through our society. In Adult Education, we hope to highlight some issues and address some questions that rose out of this encounter. Please bring an open mind and an open heart as we delve into some uncomfortable territory. We will use TED Talks as the basis for discussions.

Sept 17 - "Understanding Our Roots: White Supremacy is More Than the KKK" - video & discussion, TEDxWCC: Dr. Hephzibah V. Strmic-Pawl is a sociologist who specializes in the study of race and contemporary racial inequality, and has a focus on American multiracialism.

Sept 24 - "Understanding My Privilege" - video & discussion, TEDxPasadenaWomen: University Chancellor, Susan E. Borrego, reflects on her life as an emancipated minor and dissects the emotionally charged surrounding conversation race relations in the United States. This raconteur uses her powerful firstperson account of "White Privilege" Matter" and "Black Lives to underscore the responsibility each one of us has to bring about change.


Beatitude in Action

After a renowned career in academia, priest and author Henri Nouwen devoted his final years to living in community with and caring for adults with severe developmental disabilities. A friend once asked Nouwen if it might make more sense to spend his remaining time writing.

"I am not giving up anything," Nouwen answered. "It is I, not Adam [the man he helped with the most basic needs], who gets the main benefit from our friendship."

Nouwen didn't merely read Jesus' beatitude "Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy" (Matthew 5:7). He lived it.


