

It has probably not escaped your attention that Christmas is but a few weeks away. Our liturgical season of Advent begins the first Sunday of December, a march of four Sundays that builds in anticipation and celebration of the gift of the Messiah.

A crassly commercial "advent" has long since begun, however. I should be used to it by now, but I'm still startled when I see Christmas ornaments and Halloween costumes displayed simultaneously in store aisles. Likewise, on a recent trip to northern Wisconsin in mid-October, I was taken aback by the sight of evergreen trees being loaded and shipped. If you find yourself wondering why lots of needles are dripping off your Christmas tree, perhaps the reason is it was harvested three months earlier.

Black Friday (an infelicitous term if I ever heard one!) aggressively begins the commercial version of advent. A season proclaiming the dubious importance of excess is loosed upon us. It comes complete with scripture readings and hymns in the form of commercials.

Might I suggest that if we can't reduce our participation in the market version of Christmas, could we at least increase our participation in the missional aspects of the season? The *Christmas Joy Offering* is one of four denominational mission campaigns supporting education and leadership development at Presbyterian-related racial-ethnic schools and colleges, and support for needy retired church workers.

Or, consider looking through the *Presbyterian Giving Catalog* which lists dozens of ways gifts small and large can make a big difference in the lives of subsistence farmers in Uganda, or provide water filters in Flint, or heating fuel for Syrian refugees, or address any number of needs throughout the world. Copies of the catalog are available in the Green Room, or look up information on the internet at *presbyterianmission.org/specialofferings*.

In fact, consider tithing your Christmas spending. Total up what you spend on gifts to your family and friends this season, and give an additional 10% (or more) of that total to the church's mission programs.

It's ironic and contradictory how we respond to God's giving us what we need in the great gift of the Messiah by giving stuff to one another that (often) we don't need at all. I appreciate Frederick Zydek's poem *Praying for Stuff*; it puts this whole commercial advent habit in a new perspective.

Sometimes I forget to consider the lilies of the field which neither toil nor labor for their keep. Part of me is always searching for stuff instead of seeking ways to improve the merchandise of gratitude and prayer.

Some mornings, rather than fall to my knees to give praise, I scan the want ads for stuff.

Cheap stuff. Stuff for nothing. Stuff enough to crowd out the emptiness I know it brings....

...I have urges that want to walk the corridors of divine mysteries but spend my time gathering glitter.

Once I had a dream. I stepped before the throne of God. He asked only one question: "Did you become who you were supposed to be?"

"I'm not sure," I told him. "But when I died, I had so much stuff, it took three days to find me."

Meanwhile, I wish you a blessed Christmas, one that fills you with joy, hope, the knowledge of God's love, and the peace of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Salvation Army Christmas Food Baskets 2017

We have committed to providing 20 Christmas dinner food baskets, each including a ham. As of November 27, there were two baskets left.

If you are interested in contributing \$25 toward the cost of the hams (with or without a grocery basket), note that on the sign-up sheet as well, and put your check in the lock box outside of the Church Office, made out to Eastminster Presbyterian Church and noting "Hams" in the memo line.

If you are able to help re-assemble and deliver the baskets to the Salvation Army offices on South Pennsylvania on the morning of Tuesday, December 12, 2017, between 9 and 11 a.m., please note your commitment to help with that on the sign-up sheet as well.

The filled baskets should be delivered to Eastminster on Monday, December 11, between 9 a.m. and 3 p.m., or <u>early</u> on **Tuesday, December 12**, between 9 and 9:45 a.m. <u>If delivering on Monday, remove perishables from your basket and place them in the refrigerators, either on the main floor of the church or in the kitchen in the lower level. If delivering early on Tuesday morning, just leave your filled baskets in the church kitchen on the main floor.</u>



Eastminster has always been a welcoming place to worship. Many current members say they returned and joined because of the warmth they felt on their first visit. Our doors have always been open to everyone. We as a congregation have been proud and, dare we say, boastful about how we are a caring church.

Sadly for all of us, the world is changing. Recent incidents have caused concern among all places of worship. At its November meeting, your session discussed the need to improve church safety. It was decided that three elders should take the lead in an initiative to improve the security of our building. Norm Mackay, Robin Bell and Dave Duryea as well as deacon Heather Myer accepted the task. They will be seeking guidance from law enforcement professionals such as East Lansing Police and Ingham County Sheriff's departments. The initiative will result in adjusting some of what we have done in the past. The goal is to provide a safe place to worship while maintaining an open and welcoming experience for all who attend.

Some changes will be noticed right away while others will be more subtle. Initially you may find doors that used to be open are now locked. People might be posted at entrances. A direct emergency line of communication with police is already in place. There is a plan to replace all exterior door locks with state of the art electronic surveillance equipment. The distribution of building keys will be under tighter control. Other needs will undoubtedly be revealed as we proceed into this new venture.

Unfortunately, current events have deemed these steps to be necessary. This is uncharted territory for all of us. We ask for your understanding as we move forward together in our effort to keep Eastminster a welcoming and safe environment in which to worship the Lord.
