

Faith Alliance for Refugees (AFAR) is a local interfaith clergy group that offers programs in East Lansing to promote the understanding of Islam and Judaism. It meets monthly and has sponsored such events as prayer vigils, a pilgrimage, and interfaith services.

The forum is part of PeaceQuest 2018, a month-long celebration of the International Day of Peace with free events happening every day.

Come join us for the Christian Education kick-off. There are four classes to choose from that take place immediately following the post-worship fellowship time.

An Illustrated Invitation: This class is for preschoolers through fifth



grade. It highlights biblical stories of joining God at work in the world from Hebrew Scriptures and the New Testament. It is designed to draw children into conversation with biblical stories, showing them what god is doing, and inviting them to consider how to join in that work.


The class launches with a lesson about Abram and Sarai and how God calls them to leave their home with a promise about their future that is connected to the stars.



Faith 101: Big God, Big Questions: The first semester of our confirmation series will cover a 101 introduction on the topics of Baptism, Bible, Confessions, Jesus Christ, The Lord's Supper, Presbyterian Polity, The Presbyterians, and Worship. This opportunity is for youth going through the confirmation process as well as open to all middle and high school youth, college

students, parents, confirmation mentors, or those who want or need an introduction or refresher course.

This week's class will introduce the curriculum and talk about the topics that will be covered throughout the year. Students will be invited to share what their big questions are about God, faith, the Bible, and the church. *Dialogues on the Refugee Crisis:* Faith is not only *believing* in God, but *doing* the work of God in the world. In a time of conflict, division and



disagreement, we need tools we can use to build bridges with others and to get beyond explosive arguing. This fall Eastminster will foster a continuing group dialogue about the global refugee situation. Our goal will be to engage deeply with one another, supported by well-documented information from 1) short pre-

session "homework" readings from the participants' book, and 2) brief videos shown during the meeting sessions.

This week, participants will receive a copy of *Dialogues on the Refugee Crisis*, a book of short readings that will help to guide our discussion. We'll discuss our hopes and expectations for our continuing discussion, develop guidelines about how we want to talk with each other and solve any problems that may arise and get our first reading assignment.
