


Gracious and loving God,

Have mercy on us and forgive us, God.



RESPONSE TO THE WORD

Prayer Stations

There are two prayer stations, one in the front of the sanctuary and one in the pews, that you can experience during this time or you can use the space for silent prayer.

Station #1: Letting Go

(Reflect on the following in your seats or use one of the stations found in the front of the sanctuary.)

Then Peter said to Jesus, "Lord, how many times should I forgive my brother or sister who sins against me? Should I forgive as many as seven times?" Jesus said, "Not just seven times, but rather as many as seventy-seven times."

- Has someone done something which has hurt you, annoyed you or upset you? Holding onto these feelings traps us, makes us feel worse, which is why forgiveness is important.
- The servant was forgiven his debts. As a sign of forgiveness think about the person who has hurt you. Drop the "coin" into the water." Repeat the mantra: "God give me strength to forgive from my heart," and watch the "coin" dissolve.

Station #2: Confession

(The ropes that you need for this station are found at the end of each pew. You are welcome to take the rope home with you.)

"And forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors" (Matt 6:12).

- Take one of the ropes found in the pews. As you hold the rope in your hand, consider what you need to confess, the ways you stand in need of forgiveness.
- As each item comes to mind, make a knot in your rope. Continue this process until you have 4-5 knots in your rope.

- Go back to the first knot, holding the confession that knot represents. Hear God's assurance that you are forgiven and loved.
- As you allow yourself to feel forgiven, until each individual knot.


