Call to Confession

We enter a time of confession, knowing that our God is merciful and loving. Many names are ascribed to God - Creator, Shepherd, Mother. On the green post-it note write down a word of who God is to you. (silence)

Trusting in God's care, let us confess our sins.

Prayer of Confession

Shepherding God, we confess that while we say you provide for our needs, we don't always choose to live that way. We proclaim "I shall not want," yet constantly make wish lists of material goods and accumulate stuff we don't need. We fail to express our

gratitude for what you have provided. On the blue post-it note write down something you need. (silence)

Calling God, we confess that while we ask you to lead us down your path, there are places we don't want to go and people we don't want to interact with. On the orange post-it note write down a scary place and people whom you fear. (silence)

Assurance of Pardon

We are promised that God's love and goodness will be with us always. God comforts us, forgives us and invites us to start anew. On the red post-it note write down something that is comforting to you. (silence)

Hear the Good News: In Jesus Christ we are forgiven. As we stand in body or spirit to sing together we invite you to bring or send your responses forward.

Trip to the U.S./Mexico Border May 4-9, 2020 Douglas Arizona and Agua Prieta, Sonora, Mexico

Thank you to all those who attended the information session on Sunday. We are proceeding forward with the trip. We will be partnering with Frontera de Cristo for this immersion learning experience. You can find more information on their website, www.fronteradecristo.org. Please be in prayerful discernment if you'd like to be part of this trip and feel free to contact Kristin Stroble for more information. We are asking for a commitment as well as a deposit of \$250 by December 30th.

The approximate total cost is 1,000, but there will be scholarships available. We are hoping to have a mix of Eastminster folks and UKirk students with a limit of 14 participants.

You must have a valid passport. We will fly into Tucson International Airport. We will stay in dorm rooms in a Presbyterian Church in Agua Prieta.

Frontera de Cristo translates to "Christ's Border," and it is a Presbyterian border ministry located in the sister cities of Agua Prieta, Sonora and Douglas, Arizona.

This will be an immersion learning experience with goals to:

- Form relationships
- Build understanding of our spiritual, political, and economic connections across borders
- Challenge participants to understand the realities of life on the border
- Provide participants with enough knowledge of Frontera de Cristo to be able to interpret their mission and ministry

• Reflect and act biblically and theologically on what it means to be a disciple of Jesus when borders divide.

On their website, they describe their mission education program: "Frontera de Cristo's **Mission Education Ministry** focuses on building relationships and understanding across borders. We have facilitated the crossing of borders for more than 400 persons a year who wish to enter into relationship with their sisters and brothers in Mexico. These trips and the insight gained help churches, presbyteries, seminaries, and individuals reflect and act biblically and theologically on what it means to be disciples of Jesus Christ when borders divide.

Their staff and board of directors are made up of people from both sides of the border. "We are called to work together across national boundaries to address our common concerns as sisters and brothers equally created in the image of God. We believe that as we seek solutions, we should do so with the broadest base."
