The Story of the Jesse Tree –

During the Middle Ages, Christians created art to communicate our faith stories. One of the pictures they created used Isaiah 11:1: "A shoot shall come out from the stump of Jesse," the father of King David. Jesse is usually shown asleep at the bottom of the picture, with a branch growing out of him to show the Biblical characters who were ancestors of Jesus. Many of them have crowns on their heads because they were kings. At the top of the tree is Mary holding Jesus, the flower from Jesse's

tree.
