Per Capita

Per Capita is an essential way in which all of the congregations and the mid councils of the Presbyterian Church (USA) connect, participate and share in the work of the

wider church. We, Eastminster Presbyterian Church, pay \$32.20 per member for a total of \$5,538.40 as our per capita apportionment. This amount is used to support the presbytery, synod, and general assembly of our church. The Session would encourage any member who is able to contribute an extra \$32.20 to help offset the cost of per capita. 2019 MISSION COLLECTIONS

In consultation with Advent House, the Mission Committee has changed Eastminster's monthly collection system. There will be two collections going on all year instead of a different one every month.

We will still provide personal needs items; however, full-sized items rather than small (hotel) sizes are requested.

Please empty your bag and place the items in the labeled containers. We hope you will keep the bag with the list in your car and reuse it. If it becomes a routine, so much the better.


