building regardless of vaccination status. For those who desire more space, the service will be playing in the Green Room (west of the sanctuary).

Children are always welcome in worship at Eastminster. Your child can sit with you in the pew, sit in the space created for children at the front of the sanctuary or right now in the back of the sanctuary on the padded chairs. We have not yet resumed childcare, so if you are worried about your child getting a little wiggly or loud you can also worship in the Green Room where your child will have more space to move.

This is a livestream worship service, and the camera and microphones are on the whole time. While the camera is most often focused on the front of the sanctuary, there is a chance that you will be captured on camera. We do turn the camera off during the children's sermon and have that part audio only. If you would prefer to stay out of the camera's eye, you're encouraged to sit on the left side of the sanctuary.


#### **Time of Silence & Reflection**

# Ways you can help...

## Hurricane Relief in Louisiana

## Haiti after the August 14th earthquake

The quake and its aftershocks have left almost 1,300 people dead, thousands more injured and an unknown number of people are still missing. Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) is providing emergency relief and short-term recovery in the impacted areas.

# <u>Afghanistan</u>

St. Vincent Catholic Charities (STVCC), the only refugee resettlement site in mid-Michigan, is expecting hundreds of refugees in the next few months and 300 evacuees from Afghanistan. Afghans are coming

through a special program and therefore will not qualify for government assistance. They need our help! You can sponsor a newly arriving family. A sponsorship of \$2,000 will support a family of four for a month. Checks can be sent to St. Vincent Catholic Charities with "Afghan Sponsorship" in the memo line.
