in the building regardless of vaccination status. For those who desire more space, the service will be playing in the Green Room (west of the sanctuary).

Children are always welcome in worship at Eastminster. Your child can sit with you in the pew, sit in the space created for children at the front of the sanctuary or right now in the back of the sanctuary on the padded chairs. We have not yet resumed childcare, so if you are worried about your child getting a little wiggly or loud you can also worship in the Green Room where your child will have more space to move.

This is a livestream worship service, and the camera and microphones are on the whole time. While the camera is most often focused on the front of the sanctuary, there is a chance that you will be captured on camera. We do turn the camera off during the children's sermon and have that part audio only. If you would prefer to stay out of the camera's eye, you're encouraged to sit on the left side of the sanctuary.


Time of Reflection—Where does it hurt? *What makes your heart hurt?*

Cultured Purls Returns

After a pandemic-enforced separation, the Cultured Purls, Eastminster's knitting group, will resume meeting from 10 a.m. to noon every Thursday, starting on Oct. 7.

Advent House "Serving"

In the past, Eastminster provided meals one Saturday a month at Advent House. At that time we recruited 10 members to prepare pan meals and additional 2 – 3 people to cook and serve the meals on the

second Saturday of the month. This year we are trying something different; we are planning to recruit 8 church members to prepare 8 identical sack lunches.

The lunches should include:

- Sandwich (no peanut butter) or Quesadilla
- A drink box <u>or</u> small drink bottle <u>or</u> can
- Small bag of chips or granola bar or cheese and cracker packet
- Fresh fruit or a small fruit cup <u>or</u> a small cup of applesauce <u>or</u> a small box of raisins <u>or</u> dried cranberries
- Sandwich bag with small carrots and small celery sticks and/or sliced cucumbers (or other fresh vegetables such as cherry tomatoes) with small container of dip
- Pudding cup <u>or</u> yogurt cup

The bag should include a plastic spoon, and the front of the bag should indicate the contents. The sack lunches should be delivered to the church on the second Saturday of the month by 10:00 am. They can be dropped off on Friday upon arrangement. Our first date for delivery is October 9, 2021.

Sunday Offering Counters Needed

Eastminster needs several additional counters. The job is easy, you would work just one Sunday each month and it usually takes only about 20 minutes, immediately following worship.

We need two people — preferably not from the same household — to count each week. There are step-by-step instructions and we will schedule a short training session as soon as we hear from enough volunteers. Counters open envelopes, record the giving, make copies of checks and prepare and make the bank deposit. With fewer people attending worship in person and more folks giving online, the counting job has gotten much faster — but still necessary!
