Children are always welcome in worship at Eastminster. Your child can sit with you in the pew, sit in the space created for children at the front of the sanctuary or right now in the back of the sanctuary on the padded chairs. We have not yet resumed childcare, so if you are worried about your child getting a little wiggly or loud you can also worship in the Green Room where your child will have more space to move.

This is a livestream worship service, and the camera and microphones are on the whole time. While the camera is most often focused on the front of the sanctuary, there is a chance that you will be captured on camera. We do turn the camera off during the children's sermon and have that part audio only. If you would prefer to stay out of the camera's eye, you're encouraged to sit on the left side of the sanctuary.



# **Scripture Reading** John 15:9-17

As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. I have said these things to you so that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be complete.

'This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. You are my friends if you do what I command you. I do not call you servants any longer, because the servant does not know what the master is doing; but I have called you friends, because I have made known to you everything that I have heard from my Father. You did not choose me but I chose you. And I appointed you to go and bear fruit, fruit that will last, so that the Father will give you whatever you ask him in my name. I am giving you these commands so that you may love one another.

#### **Conversation & Connection**

#### Conversation round 1

1. What place feels most like home? What do you love about it?

- 2. How did you get connected to this faith community? What is one of your favorite memories here?
- 3. What is one thing that the pandemic brought into your life that you would like to keep or hold onto?
- 4. What is a hope you have for yourself in the coming year? For your family? For the church? For this city?

#### Conversation round 2

- 1. What brings you joy these days?
- 2. What weighs heavy on you, or causes you grief?
- 3. What is something you have learned about yourself in the past year?
- 4. If you could go back in time and teach your younger self one lesson, what would it be?

#### Conversation round 3

- 1. What's your favorite family tradition? Or, what's a tradition you want to start and pass along to those you love?
- 2. We often talk about "mountain top" experiences in our faith places where God feels close. Where is a place that you have felt close to God? What was holy about it?
- 3. Share a key moment in your faith journey. How did that moment shape what you believe today?
- 4. Who is someone who has been influential in your faith? What impact did they have?

### Conversation round 4

- 1. Is there a story behind your given name or your surname? If you have a nickname or a chosen name, how is this name meaningful to you?
- 2. Share a memory related to food a family recipe, a baking ritual or a time of breaking bread with loved ones.

- 3. What is your first memory of grief? What have you learned from your grief?
- 4. Share a story of a time when you felt the most like yourself.

While the song, "All Belong Here" by the Many, plays respond to the reflection prompts on prayer cards.


<u>Front of the card</u>: What made you feel connected in your conversation?
