While the camera is most often focused on the front of the sanctuary, there is a chance that you will be captured on camera. We do turn the camera off during the children's sermon and have that part audio only. If you would prefer to stay out of the camera's eye, you're encouraged to sit on the left side of the sanctuary.

Words for the Beginning by Rev. Sarah Speed If I could give you words for the very beginning-for the stretches and the yawns, and the opening of eyes, for the first hiccups, and the first smiles, and the first purse of your lips, I would say, "Oh dear child, how you are loved."


