We do turn the camera off during the children's sermon and have that part audio only. If you would prefer to stay out of the camera's eye, you're encouraged to sit on the left side of the sanctuary.

P. and victory over the powers of evil.


- L. These are expressions of a truth which remains beyond the reach of all theory in the depths of God's love for humankind.
