
WELCOME!

online, you are welcome here.

Masks are now optional in the building. If Ingham County moves to a high level again (based on the CDC community



levels) we will require masks again. We do have masks available at the welcome table.

Children are always welcome in worship at Eastminster. Your child can sit with you in the pew, sit in the space created for children at the front of the sanctuary. We have not yet resumed childcare, so if you are worried about your child getting a little wiggly or loud you can also worship in the Green Room where your child will have more space to move.

This is a livestream worship service, and the camera and microphones are on the whole time. While the camera is most often focused on the front of the sanctuary, there is a chance that you will be captured on camera. We do turn the camera off during the children's sermon and have that part audio only. If you would prefer to stay out of the camera's eye, you're encouraged to sit on the left side of the sanctuary.




Hope in One Golf Outing

MSU Alumni Chapel Tour

On Wednesday, July 13, we will be touring the MSU Alumni Memorial

Chapel. Dedicated on June 7, 1952, it is only the second such building built for a Big Ten school. It is an interdenominational chapel, built with stones from all over the world, some more than 500 years old and some from bombed-out churches. Others came from Westminster Abbey, the Notre Dame Cathedral and the White House. One stone is from a synagogue in Capernium where Jesus is reported to have preached. Carved into the



chapel entrance wall are 487 names of alumni who died in wars. The oldest names are from the Class of 1861, honoring students who died in the Civil War. A new organ was installed in 2020 and dedicated earlier this year.
