We will be resuming childcare today. Our nursery is on the lower level for children 3 and under. It is staffed by two background-checked volunteers.

While the camera is most often focused on the front of the sanctuary, there is a chance that you will be captured on camera. We do turn the camera off during the children's sermon and have that part audio only. If you would prefer to stay out of the camera's eye, you're encouraged to sit on the left side of the sanctuary.



And yet, we forget to forgive 70 times seven, To love our neighbors as ourselves, To live like the body of Christ, To embrace our belovedness.


Why is it so hard to remember the right things?


