For 2022, Eastminster has committed to providing Thanksgiving food baskets for 10 families. The program, coordinated by Christian Services, will provide groceries to prepare a complete Thanksgiving meal. We are asking congregation members to volunteer for one of two activities for this initiative. First, we are asking that members volunteer to purchase the items for a food basket. The filled baskets should be returned to the church on Thursday, November 17th between 10am and 4pm or Friday, November 18th between 5pm and 7pm.

We are also asking for volunteers to deliver the food baskets sometime between November 19-22nd. Baskets can be picked up for delivery at the church between November 19-22nd. Each basket will have the name and phone number of the family to receive the basket. We ask the volunteers who agree to deliver the baskets to call the recipients and arrange a time the baskets can be dropped off.
