


Service for the Lord's Day February 12, 2023

may we be ambassadors of grace.


Instead of continual complaining,

Souper Bowl of Caring, February 12th

"Even as we prepare to watch a football game, Lord, let us be mindful of those without a bowl of soup to eat." Those words of a prayer at a Presbyterian Church in South Carolina started a movement. Today, we will be taking part in the Souper Bowl of Caring. This youth inspired movement began in 1990, and has raised over \$170 million dollars to fight hunger over the past 30 years. Last year alone, over \$10 million dollars was collected and the monies stay local and go directly to those tackling hunger.

Eastminster's collection will once again go to MSU Student Food Bank. MSU Student Food Bank serves food insecure students and their families and our collection can help them continue those efforts. How can you give?
