


Service for the Lord's Day October 22, 2023

## Sunday, Nov. 12, 1 p.m. People's Church



The Peoples Church is hosting Kristin Kobes Du Mez for our annual Henry & Annabel Memorial Lecture. Du Mez is a New York Times bestselling author and Professor of History and Gender Studies at Calvin University. She holds a PhD from the University of Notre Dame and her research focuses on the intersection of gender,

religion, and politics. She has written for The New York Times, The Washington Post, NBC News, Religion News Service, and Christianity Today, and has been interviewed on NPR, CBS, and the BBC, among other outlets. Her most recent book is 'Jesus and John Wayne: How White Evangelicals Corrupted a Faith and Fractured a Nation.'
