


Service for the Lord's Day December 3, 2023

Remind us that healing takes time, and that joy and grief can coexist.


For the weary edges of our faith that struggle to hold onto hope, Forgive us. Remind us of Zechariah and Elizabeth.




Sharing of the Bread and Cup
