Even though I walk through the darkest valley, I fear no evil; for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me.


Forgive us for refusing your comfort and care. Forgive us for acting out of fear instead of trust.

The Daily Examen

This practice is a way to reflect on our day, see God's presence, and to discern God's direction for us. You can do this practice alone or with others.

- 1. Settle into a comfortable spot and come into God's presence with silence or with a simple affirmation: "God, I'm here." Some find it helpful to light a candle.
- 2. Recall the day silently for a few minutes or if you are doing this with others, name the events of the day.
- 3. Review the day more deeply. Be with whatever you feel without trying to change or fix it in any way. Ask yourself:
 - a. Where did I notice God's presence?
 - b. When did I feel the most alive?
 - c. When did I have the greatest sense of belonging to myself, to others, to creation, and to God?
 - d. Where or when didn't I feel the presence of God?
 - e. Where did I lack joy or peace?
 - f. What was the low point?
- 4. Give thanks for what you have experienced. Consider where God is calling you to grow in this. Accept God's tenderness.
- 5. Look ahead to the next day and the opportunities it may offer you to experience God's presence in your life. Express your hopes for the day to God. In what ways can you share God's love with another?
